Arrival in Tyrol

1. Personal Registration

Please register yourself.

Possibilities for registration are available here:

- Arrival centre Hotel Europa:

- Registration Office Police Station Kufstein (AGM Bahnhof):

 Hauptplatz 5a, 9900 Lienz, daily 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
- Registration Office Police Inspectorate Reutte:
 Obermarkt 2, 6600 Reutte,
 Tuesday and Thursday from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
- Registration Office Police Inspectorate Imst:
 Rathausstraße 14, 6460 Imst,
 Monday and Thursday from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Please note: When registering, your personal data will be recorded, which is relevant for further services - for example, the processing of basic care and employment opportunities.

2. Health check and accommodation

If you do not have accommodation yet, please contact the arrival centre in Innsbruck. There you will be allocated accommodation and your transport will be organised. If you already have accommodation, please still report to the arrival centre for a health check and registration.

Note: The health check for persons seeking protection from Ukraine includes a corona test, the tuberculosis screening and additional medical examinations if required.

3. Registration in your municipality of residence

Once the registration, health check and accommodation allocation have taken place, you will subsequently report to the registration office in the municipality/city where your accommodation is located. The registration of residence should be done no later than three days after moving into the accommodation.

People who have fled Ukraine can currently travel free of charge on ÖBB trains throughout Austria with the "Not-Ticket Ukraine". The "Not-Ticket Ukraine" is available free of charge either on the train from the staff or at the ÖBB ticket counters in the stations.
