SEVEN FUNDAMENTAL PRINCIPLES

The seven Fundamental Principles represent the system of values of the international Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement.

Humanity People caring for people.

Impartiality Aid doesn't differentiate.

Neutrality Humanitarian initiatives need trust.

Independence Our principles are maintained through self-determination.

Voluntary Service True aid must be free of self-interest.

Unity Only one in any given country, open to all.

Universality Humanitarian values are global.

THE RED CROSS – A SYMBOL, THE WHOLE WORLD TRUSTS IN

Protected to be able to protect.

The **Red Cross** and **Red Crescent** protect humanitarian and medical staff, buildings and equipment of the national red cross and red crescent societies as well as the medical corps in times of military conflicts.

Since 2006 the **Red Crystal** also has been recognized.

In 2020

- Donations and membership fees amounted to **€ 85,038,320.**
- **Time-donations** helped the Austrian state and society save several millions (approx. **12 million hours** worked voluntarily in 2021).

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SYSTEM

The rescue and ambulance service is the best known area of the Austrian Red Cross.

The Red Cross provides these services in Austria across the whole country.

- More than **3 million rescue and ambulance operations** across Austria every year.



AUSTRIAN RED CROSS

BLOOD PROGRAM

Every day up to **1000 units of blood are required** to meet the country's hospitals' needs.

- 4 blood banks (full scale, including production)
- 3 blood banks in cooperation with university clinics
- voluntary and unpaid blood donation
- secured supply with blood and blood products in Austria
- highest security level for donors and recipients
- quality assurance and control



AUSTRIAN RED CROSS

HEALTH AND COMMUNITY SERVICES

Austria in 2050: More than 900.000 people are 80-plus years old. Who will care for those who find it more and more difficult to cope with everyday life? The Austrian Red Cross is trying to help by extending home care services and offering a wider range of at-home assistance.

- home care services
- offering companionship and assistance
- “meals on wheels” and “Direct Call”
- services for senior citizens
- hospice activities, individual social care



AUSTRIAN RED CROSS

DISASTER RELIEF

- The Austrian Red Cross' independent disaster relief service provides unbureaucratic assistance in the event of urgent demand in **national and international emergencies**.
- **There are 3 kinds of help:** financial support, personal support, relief goods.
- Emergency Response Units of the Austrian Red Cross are able to reach victims worldwide within a few hours.



AUSTRIAN RED CROSS

DEVELOPMENT COOPERATION

- An emergency response operation starts immediately after the disaster. But when does it end? As soon as people are able to help themselves again.
- The long-term and sustainable programmes and projects of the Austrian Red Cross follow immediately after the disaster relief phase and are implemented within the worlds biggest humanitarian network.

International Cooperation 2021

Ukraine Crisis 2022

- Our long-term partners: Austrian Red Cross works in Eastern Africa (Ethiopia, Rwanda, Uganda), in South-Eastern and Eastern Europe (Montenegro, North Macedonia, Serbia, Ukraine), in the Southern Caucasus (Armenia, Georgia) and the Middle East (Lebanon, Syria).
- Additionally, Austrian Red Cross was active in these countries as part of its international cooperation in 2021.

Ukraine crisis 2022

The Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement is active in Ukraine and neighbouring countries Moldova, Romania, Hungary, Slovakia, Poland, Belarus, and the Russian Federation - supporting with food items, water and sanitation, shelter, mattresses, blankets, and tarpaulins. The Red Cross also offers medical help for sick and war-wounded persons. Other activities include family reunification and dissemination of International Humanitarian Law. In the long term, we support families with cash assistance, rebuilding of livelihoods, and capacity building for the Ukrainian Red Cross. In Austria, refugees receive accommodation, food, and medical services while Red Cross volunteers support their social integration.

The rules of war

International Humanitarian Law seeks to limit the effects of armed conflict. It protects people who are not or are no longer participating in hostilities and restricts the means and methods of warfare. Civilian infrastructure like hospitals, schools, water, and electricity supply systems must not be attacked.

Through its dialogue with all conflict parties the Red Cross aims for:

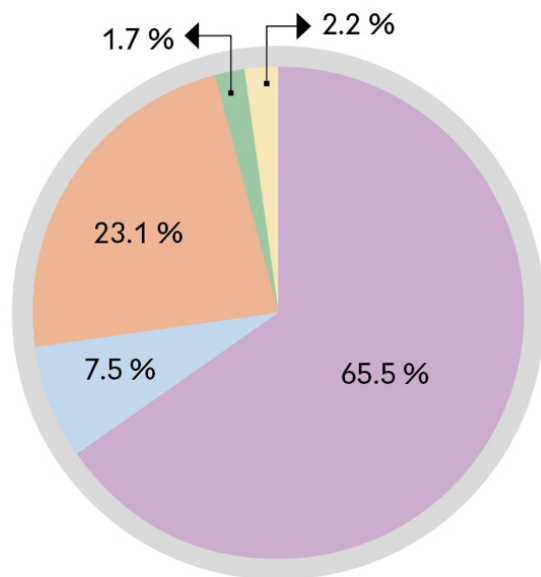
- safe passage for civilians from besieged towns and areas of fighting
- provision of humanitarian aid on all sides of an armed conflict
- protection of those who are not or no longer participating in fighting
- humane treatment of prisoners of war and other persons deprived of liberty

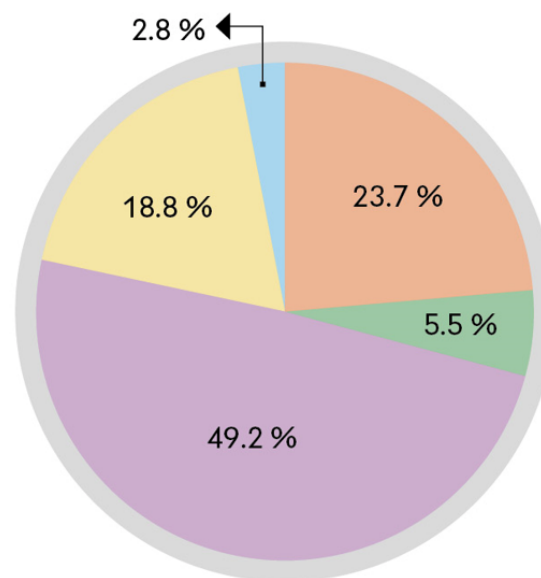

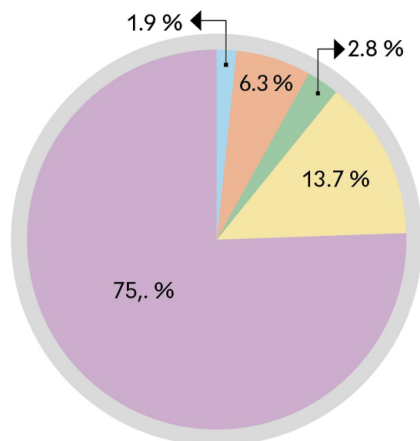


Utilisation of Funds by Region

AUSTRIAN RED CROSS

DISSEMINATION OF INTERNATIONAL HUMANITARIAN LAW (IHL)

- Information and trainings about the application of the Geneva Conventions in times of peace and conflicts
- Close contact to authorities concerning further development of the IHL



AUSTRIAN RED CROSS

TRACING SERVICE

- Tracing people who have been separated by wars, armed conflicts or disasters.
- Reunion of separated families.
- Delivering family news internationally when normal means of communication have broken down due to war or disaster. This is done using a Red Cross message.
- Helping to obtain confirmation of detention, where an imprisoned person has been visited by the ICRC.
- Part of the worldwide tracetheface.org network.

TRAINING SERVICES

- Basic first aid courses are held in every Red Cross branch. Apart from first aid instruction, a variety of training programmes within the health and social services and for paramedics is offered. **310,996** people took part.
- In this regard the Austrian Red Cross pays equal attention to the education of the general public as well as to the basics and further training of the staff and volunteers of the general public.

AUSTRIAN YOUTH RED CROSS

The Austrian Youth Red Cross (AYRC), a division of the Austrian Red Cross, is a community of **interests that provides training and education for children, young people, and teachers, as well as teaching materials.**



One goal is to **help children and young people who are in crisis situations**, both in Austria and abroad, by providing hands-on experiences that install humanitarian values.

The diverse activities of the Austrian Youth Red Cross aim to develop self-motivation and the ability to help others, as well as personal and social responsibility.
