Strengthening the European Civil Protection Mechanisms through a cross border Water Purification Module



This project is co-funded

Objectives and expected results

The project is based on 20 years of experience and long term cooperation of the project partners in international disaster relief especially in the field of water purification (e.g. in 2010 deployments to Tanzania, Haiti, Pakistan; trainings in Austria, Ethiopia, Hungary, Lithuania, Romania, Sudan).

- XH2O will establish a multinational cross border Water Purification Module (WPM) under participation of project partners from Austria, Croatia and Slovenia according to the module-standards of the European Commission.
- The module will be capable of producing 225.000 litres of drinking water per day at least according to WHO standards.
- The WPM includes a field laboratory, mobile water purification units and storage capacity.
- XH2O will also deliver a fully functional web-based HR database and a functional framework of cooperation of the project partners. The standard operating procedures of the WPM will comply with the EU Civil Protection (CP) mechanism.
- The module makes use of existing WPM equipment and staff of the project partners, thus ensuring cost-efficiency.



- Training an additional pool of 40 personnel (amongst them 15 potential team leaders) will ensure fast and efficient deployment over a period of up to 12 weeks.
- The multi-lingual and multi-cultural set-up of the first cross border WPM will lead to high usability worldwide and in the partnering countries.
- The WPM will be registered in CECIS by the Austrian Federal Ministry of Interior (MoI) being deployable within the framework of the EU CP mechanism in consultation with the Croatian and Slovenian CP authorities.
- Visibility of the project and the EU CP in media and expert circles will lead to raised awareness and acceptance of the EU CP mechanism in in CEE countries.

4. Two "Practical Trainings" on field level (at least 60 persons)
5. One "Review Workshop" for the European water purification-community
